15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary approach to education is a paradigm that transcends the traditional boundaries of academic disciplines, fostering a holistic understanding of complex issues through the integration of diverse perspectives, methodologies, and subject areas. At its core, the multidisciplinary approach emphasizes collaboration and synergy among different fields of study. Rather than compartmentalizing knowledge into distinct disciplines, this approach encourages the exploration of connections and intersections between various domains. By bringing together insights from disciplines such as science, humanities, social sciences, and the arts, students gain a more comprehensive understanding of real-world phenomena and challenges. Uluberia College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and thereby is bound to follow the syllabi and guidelines propounded by the university. In the academic session 2018-19 University of Calcutta introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) which revolves the path of learning towards multidisciplinary approach. For example, skill based courses are introduced in various disciplines; compulsory Environmental Studies, Bengali and English language courses are introduced to the students of all streams (Humanities, Science and Commerce). In the academic year 2023-24 the university introduced the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) system following the guidelines of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This system is much more akin towards multidisciplinary approach of learning. Within the stipulated framework students can consider one Major discipline, one Minor discipline and one Interdisciplinary Course (IDC) along with Skill Development courses and language courses. This system also enables the students to experience internship in various specialised aspects of their chosen discipline thereby providing them with a practical learning environment. The CCF system is a progressive approach towards better learning by allowing the students to engage in cross-disciplinary dialogues, critical thinking and problem-solving and cultivating skills essential for navigating today's complex global landscape. Furthermore, the

CCF system promotes a more holistic view of education, where students learn to appreciate the interconnectedness of knowledge and its relevance to real-world issues. By bridging the gap between theory and practice, students develop a deeper appreciation for the value of their education and its potential impact on society.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic bank of credits (ABC): The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system is a virtual storehouse that contains information of credits earned by individual students. It allows the students multiple entry and exit points in a particular course as well as enables them to move from one institution to another seamlessly keeping a track of their earned credits throughout their journey of learning. ABC id gives the students the chance to utilise the National Credit Transfer Framework (NCTF). Under the purview of NCTF the students can learn from various MOOCs made available online by the government like SWAYAM, NPTEL, NDL, Swayamprabha etc. and collect their credits in their assigned ABC id. Uluberia College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta which has implemented the Academic Credit Bank system from the 2024-25 session. There will be a mandatory column in the registration form from this year to insert the ABC id. This is definitely a welcoming initiative made by the university keeping in mind the new CCF system which has been introduced from 2023-24 session following the NEP 2020. This will certainly provide the students a better opportunity to venture new avenues of learning and forge firmer grasp over skill based learning which is the need of the hour.

17.Skill development:

Skill development: (NEP) 2020 of India advocates for a transformative shift towards skill-based education, aiming to equip learners with practical abilities essential for their holistic development and employability. This paradigm emphasizes the integration of vocational training with academic learning, fostering a dynamic educational ecosystem. NEP 2020 underscores the importance of early exposure to vocational skills, enabling students to explore diverse career pathways and make informed choices. By promoting experiential learning and apprenticeship, the policy seeks to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications. Uluberia College follows the syllabi of University of Calcutta under CBCS and CCF system following NEP 2020. As per the curriculum under CBCS and CCF system Skill Enhancement Courses are taught in various subjects. The college's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has suggested implementing Add-on courses across all departments, making them compulsory for every student in the college. The

college offered thirty-two such courses which aim to provide the students with exposure beyond their regular curriculum. The selection of topics for these Add-on courses was carefully considered to ensure they offer knowledge that extends beyond what is typically covered in the curriculum. The college has taken up additional initiatives to organize various skill development activities like Spoken Sanskrit Course, Communicative English Courses, Computer Concept Courses in collaboration with The Institute of Computer Engineers (India), Certificate courses in Advanced Excel Training in collaboration with Right Brains Technology etc. To promote physical fitness and self-defence the college has introduced Yoga Classes in collaboration with SRI SRI RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME TRUST and Karate classes in collaboration with Traditional Shoto Karate Association of Bengal (TSKAB). A hands-on training workshop for soap making has been conducted under the supervision of Dr. Shyamal Kumar Sarkar by the Department of Chemistry. A three Months Certificate Course on "Mushroom Cultivation Practices" in collaboration with CCAE, Vidyasagar University, is carried out by the Department of Botany on particular intervals. The college has introduced a certificate course on CPBFI (Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance and Insurance) in collaboration with Centum Learning Limited, a Training Partner of Bajaj Finserv Limited, to provide the students with best opportunities for career advancement and specific skill development. To promote value education among the students and to nurture socially responsible citizens the college organizes social outreach activities. A collaborative cultural programme was organized where specially-abled children from a local special educational institute "ASHA BHABAN", participated alongside the students of our college. The students of our college went on an outreach programme at a local orphanage "CHIRONABIN" to socialize with the children out there thus ensuring experiential social learning. College Journal: Uluberia College releases a peer-reviewed journal titled QUEST, aiming to foster research acumen among both faculty members and students. Additionally, various departments contribute to the publication of wall magazines and e-magazines as part of their efforts to promote scholarly endeavours. The Placement Cell of Uluberia College has enabled a Competitive Examination Portal for training the students for various competitive examinations in collaboration with Right Brains Technology.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The Indian Knowledge System (IKS) is a rich and diverse tapestry of intellectual traditions that has flourished over millennia,

encompassing philosophy, science, arts, literature, and spirituality. Rooted in ancient texts like the Vedas, Upanishads, and epics, IKS embodies a holistic understanding of life, the universe, and existence itself. At the heart of IKS lies the concept of interconnectedness, where various branches of knowledge are viewed as interlinked and mutually reinforcing. This holistic perspective is evident in disciplines such as Ayurveda, Yoga, and Vastu Shastra, which emphasize harmony between the body, mind, and environment. NEP 2020 has recognised the relevance and value of IKS, and has integrated it within the modern education system. Its focus on learning in vernacular medium has reinforced the knowledge of local languages, art and culture to its optimum use. The faculties and students of Uluberia College are always prompt at learning and manifesting their indigenous language, culture and knowledge. The Bangla Bhasha and Sahitya department organizes seminars and academic programmes on 21st February every year to commemorate the International Mother Language Day. The department of Sanskrit has organised a Spoken Sanskrit Programme in collaboration with Sanskrit Bharti from 17th to 27th November 2022. The practice of Yoga and meditation is a regular custom among the students of Uluberia College.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): To ensure high academic standards across all areas, the institution maintains a focus on continuous quality enhancement through outcome-based education. Teaching and learning challenges are addressed through ongoing formative assessment and curriculum mapping. The curriculum is regularly updated by Calcutta University to stay abreast of evolving knowledge requirements and to fulfill specified learning objectives, ensuring that each student attains the intended goals upon completion of their education. The institute has established a structured mentor-mentee program where faculty members play various roles such as instructors, trainers, facilitators, or mentors, depending on the desired outcomes. Alumni seminars are conducted to share success stories with current students, inspiring them to concentrate on their studies by illustrating the potential outcomes of their chosen curriculum.

20.Distance education/online education:

Distant Education/ Online education: Uluberia College offers Distance Education Postgraduate Courses under Vidyasagar University in Bengali, History, Sanskrit, English, Botany, Mathematics and Zoology since 2008. However, due to certain unavoidable circumstances Postgraduate courses in Botany, Mathematics and

Zoology were discontinued. Bachelor of Library Science course was introduced in 2018. Under the affiliation of Netaji Subhas Open University Undergraduate Honours courses and Postgraduate courses in Bengali, English, Political Science and History were introduced. Postgraduate Course in Mathematics, MLIS and MSW courses also started in the year 2018. All the classes of distance education are resumed to offline mode once again post-pandemic. The Distance Education facility of our college caters to a large section of students, who face difficulty in continuing their educational endeavours in regular mode, thereby, enabling a comprehensive learning environment.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Uluberia College offers 18 Undergraduate Courses including B.A., B.Sc, and B.Com. along with 2 Post Graduate Programmes following the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) or Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) as framed by the University of Calcutta (CU). Besides, the college runs a separate Bed section. At the beginning of every

academic year, IQAC in consultation with the college authority prepares an academic calendar following the University. The Routine Committee prepares a master routine and faculty members meticulously prepare tentative month-wise lesson plans following the departmental curriculum plan.

In academics, highest priority is given to teaching-learning process and lecture sessions are delivered through both conventional chalk and talk way. The College has adequate laboratory facilities and periodic upgradation of laboratories are taken up for effective curriculum delivery. Regular field works and educational tours are conducted by departments for the cognitive and psychomotor development of students.

The Uluberia College library is a repository of a good number of books and journals which is a special help to learners. The library provides OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogues) and N-LIST facilities for its users. The college has developed an App named "Uluberia College" for effective curriculum delivery, conduct of online examinations etc.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Uluberia College is affiliated with the University of Calcutta and follows its prescribed syllabus and curriculum. However, the college enhances the standard curriculum by incorporating experiential and participatory learning opportunities.

Courses that involve practical activities allow students to engage in hands-on learning through lab experiments, using low-cost, easily accessible tools, conducting fieldwork, preparing reports, making presentations, and attending workshops. These experiences help reinforce theoretical knowledge by emphasizing its real-world application.

For instance, students take part in workshops where they learn to grow mushrooms, and they organize a "Campus Bazar" where they sell products like handmade soaps, seed pencils, and decorative items made from recycled materials, all created by the students themselves.

To further encourage participative learning, the college organizes regular student seminars across departments. During these seminars, students present their ideas through creative methods such as PowerPoint presentations, group demonstrations, poster sessions, and even skits. Since these activities involve collaboration, they ensure that students actively participate in the learning process.

Additionally, senior students teach junior students in special classes, under faculty supervision, providing an opportunity for peer learning and reinforcing teaching skills.

Students also engage in NCC and NSS community outreach programs, such as clean-up drives, anti-tobacco campaigns, tree planting, and the adoption of plants around the campus. These activities help raise awareness about social responsibility and contribute to their overall development as responsible individuals.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

To evaluate student progress, faculty use a variety of assessment methods, including class tests, surprise quizzes, and class presentations. After completing each module, teachers administer tests either as spontaneous in-class assessments or online exams through the Learning Management System (LMS) portal. Graded answer scripts are shared with students to help them understand their performance and address any mistakes.

Class presentations, where individual students or groups present on specific topics from the course, are another method of assessment. These presentations are followed by a question-and-answer session led by the teacher, encouraging discussion and helping students develop presentation skills, critical thinking, and the ability to express their ideas clearly. The class tests primarily consist of multiple-choice or short-answer questions, designed to evaluate students' analytical skills based on the material covered in class.

In the currently introduced Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) the university has introduced a Project work of twenty-five marks which allows the faculty members to indulge the students in project-oriented research and also group learning.

The mapping of Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) is a vital process in educational institutions, ensuring that the overall goals of a program align with the specific learning outcomes of individual courses. This process involves correlating each course outcome with one or more program outcomes using parameters such as slight, moderate, or substantial correlation. For this mapping, we use the following correlation scale: "1" for Slight (Low) Correlation, "2" for Moderate (Medium) Correlation, "3" for Substantial (High) Correlation, and "-" to indicate no correlation.

Once the mapping is complete, course outcomes are incorporated into the curriculum, and appropriate assessment methods are designed to measure how well these outcomes are being achieved. Direct assessment, which includes 70% weight from university exams and 30%

from internal assessments, evaluates the attainment of course outcomes. Indirect assessment, gathered through graduate exit surveys and alumni feedback, holds equal weight.

The overall attainment level is calculated by combining both direct and indirect assessments. A gap analysis is then conducted to identify any differences between the target and actual attainment levels. When gaps are found, corrective actions are implemented to close these discrepancies, thereby improving the course content and overall educational quality. The combination of PO-CO mapping and gap analysis helps institutions achieve their desired program outcomes. By taking targeted actions for each specific PO, institutions can better prepare students for their future careers and ensure continuous improvement.

The college also offers a first aid station, regular medical check-ups, a sanitary napkin vending machine, and an incinerator in the Ladies Common Room. Solid waste is separated into designated containers and disposed of with the assistance of Uluberia Municipality. Additionally, housekeeping staff from Uluberia Municipality, sort the waste daily as per provided instructions and demonstrations. Recognizing these efforts, Uluberia Municipality, Howrah, awarded Uluberia College a Certificate of Completion for the "Campus Clean Drive" initiative, acknowledging its effective daily management of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste.

To ensure the proper disposal of E-waste, Uluberia College has signed a MoU with Hulladek Recycling Pvt. Ltd. The college periodically disposes of significant amounts of E-waste through this partnership. An effort to promote sustainability, Uluberia College has implemented a recycling initiative where plastic bottles are repurposed for manual drip irrigation and as planter pots to enhance

To evaluate student progress, faculty use a variety of assessment methods, including class tests, surprise quizzes, and class presentations. After completing each module, teachers administer tests either as spontaneous in-class assessments or online exams through the Learning Management System (LMS) portal. Graded answer scripts are shared with students to help them understand their performance and address any mistakes.

Class presentations, where individual students or groups present on specific topics from the course, are another method of assessment. These presentations are followed by a question-and-answer session led by the teacher, encouraging discussion and helping students develop presentation skills, critical thinking, and the ability to express their ideas clearly. The class tests primarily consist of multiple-choice or short-answer questions, designed to evaluate students' analytical skills based on the

material covered in class.

The mapping of Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) is a vital process in educational institutions, ensuring that the overall goals of a program align with the specific learning outcomes of individual courses. This process involves correlating each course outcome with one or more program outcomes using parameters such as slight, moderate, or substantial correlation. For this mapping, we use the following correlation scale: "1" for Slight (Low) Correlation, "2" for Moderate (Medium) Correlation, "3" for Substantial (High) Correlation, and "-" to indicate no correlation.

Once the mapping is complete, course outcomes are incorporated into the curriculum, and appropriate assessment methods are designed to measure how well these outcomes are being achieved. Direct assessment, which includes 70% weight from university exams and 30% from internal assessments, evaluates the attainment of course outcomes. Indirect assessment, gathered through graduate exit surveys and alumni feedback, holds equal weight.

The overall attainment level is calculated by combining both direct and indirect assessments. A gap analysis is then conducted to identify any differences between the target and actual attainment levels. When gaps are found, corrective actions are implemented to close these discrepancies, thereby improving the course content and overall educational quality. The combination of PO-CO mapping and gap analysis helps institutions achieve their desired program outcomes. By taking targeted actions for each specific PO, institutions can better prepare students for their future careers and ensure continuous improvement.

Additionally, housekeeping staff from Uluberia Municipality, sort the waste daily as per provided instructions and demonstrations. Recognizing these efforts, Uluberia Municipality, Howrah, awarded Uluberia College a Certificate of Completion for the "Campus Clean Drive" initiative, acknowledging its effective daily management of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste.

To ensure the proper disposal of E-waste, Uluberia College has signed a MoU with Hulladek Recycling Pvt. Ltd. The college periodically disposes of significant amounts of E-waste through this partnership.
