

The college started its journey on 1st August, 1948 with a handful of boys and girls, Sri Ghoshal, was the founder Principal of the college. With the passage of time, Uluberia College as an institution of higher studies imparting Under Graduate courses to all aspiring learners from diverse communities and economic background has prepared, modified and upgraded itself to meet the academic challenges and changing demands of the learners and society. The acceptance of accreditation system by NAAC in colleges and universities has undoubtedly become much more beneficial for the improvement of academic atmosphere of the educational institutions and institution is no exception.

Besides efficiently carrying on the regular and traditional form of imparting UG courses in the Arts, Science and Commerce Stream, the curriculum has now diversified to conduct Post Graduate courses in Bengali and Mathematics. 



Department of Sanskrit

In the eighth schedule of Indian constitution six Indian languages are recognized as “Classical Language”. Sanskrit is one of them. It was considered in the year 2005. Although India does not have any national language but on the National Language debate of Constituent Assembly Dr. Ambedkar brought an amendment on September 10, 1949 which proposed Sanskrit as ‘the official language of India. Latter it was dismissed by the Constituent Assembly and adopted Hindi as an Official Language of India by Article 343.

Sanskrit is the language in which ever first book of the world Rgveda was written. On astronomical grounds Maratha Kesari Bal Gangadhar Tilak dated Rgveda to 6000 BCE. Westerner Jacobi held that Vedic civilization flourished between 4500 BCE and 2500 BCE. Whatsoever it is, but we all have agreed that Rgveda was compiled before 1500 BCE. So there has no doubt on Sanskrit’s ancient heritage. This Indo Aryan Language is an ocean of gems, and we are privileged to come across some of them.

Uluberia College started its journey on 16th August, 1948 but our Sanskrit Department came to exist from the month of September, 2008 with approximately 60 General course students and a single teacher of it. Sanskrit Honours course was introduced on 2010. It strengthens the language section or the college and helps in the interaction and exchange of ideas among the three language departments.







Library and Reading Room

The Central Library of the College provides open access facility and it is partly automated. The Reading Room of the library is fully air-conditioned. 

Location & Infrastructure

Location

The College has a locational advantage in being situated at the heart of this sub-divisional town of Uluberia and is easily accessible by train and bus from Kolkata and as well as Hooghly and Midnapore Districts. There are two railway stations, Fuleswar and Uluberia from where students and staff can avail Toto and autorickshaw to reach the college campus. Bus routes also conveniently connect the college with Bombay Road (NH-6).



Campus

The college has three storied main building with an auditorium, Haripada Mancha; one, two storied B.Ed. building and one, three storied administrative building with Commerce Department and one, two storied building containing Botany department and Ladies Common Room. There is a beautiful circular pond in front of the approach road towards the college campus and surrounding the pond, there is a sprawling garden with many coconut trees and flowering plants. The garden is maintained by a professional gardener thus giving a magnificent look to the college.

Gymnasium

The College can boast of a very well-equipped Gymnasium. Now it is open both for the Staffs and the students.



Common Room and Canteen

There are two large separate common rooms for boys and girls. The indoor Games facilities are available. Tea, tiffin and other foods are available at subsidised rate only for the current college students at the college can't.

Computer Centre

The college has one Computer Centre run in technical collaboration with the Institute of Computer Engineers (India). The Centre has good arrangements of effective theoretical and practical classes which are held regularly during scheduled days for all categories of students, both inside and out side the institution.

The college has one large capacity 85 KVA green set generator for uninterrupted supply of electricity as and when required.



Recent Infrastructural Development

With the endeavour of the present Governing Body and cooperation of State Government, UGC, Central Government, Teachers, Students and Non-teaching Staff along with the local people, following development works have been undertaken. Some of which are already completed and others are in progress.

1. Beautification of the college campus with gardening (is going on.)
2. Two floors of B.Ed. Building and renovation of its class rooms have already been completed and some new Building is going on.
3. Beautification of the pond in the college with proper fencing and garden.
4. A three storied Boys Common Room, Boys' Canteen and students Union Room have been constructed.

13. Principal's room, entire office space including Head-clerks, Account Section and all the Staff's Rooms have been made air conditioned and refurbished.
14. A Gymnasium with modern equipments has been developed for the male and female students.
15. The college has already developed a solar panel grid for green power and a plant of rain water harvesting system, by the help of State Government.
16. Many LCD projects and audio systems and 9 smart class rooms have been designed to cope with the modern method of teaching.
17. A large three storied building between chemistry department and B.Ed. Section is in progress.
18. A large two storied building between Botany department and general Staffs' room has been constructed for the extension of teacher's canteen, seminar room, Botany department and Microbiology Laboratory, library and others.
19. The Lavatories of the different departments for the use of students, teachers and non-teaching staffs' have been constructed.

Awareness Programmes






Learning Management Service: A learning management system software is started in the college under the Uluberia College App project.

- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
- Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters,
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- Fine of Rs.25000/-
- Collective punishment: When the person committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.


